Yale } present that Ah Ho on the twenty-third day of
To wit } November in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and eighty seven the dwelling

1. house of Joseph Brunet and Charles Debarro situate at Granite Creek feloniously did break and enter, with intent the goods and chattels of the said Joseph Brunet and Charles Debarro in the said dwelling house there being, feloniously to steal take and carry away said five ounces of platinum and one ounce of gold of the value of twenty seven dollars of the goods and chattels of the said Joseph Brunet and Charles Debarro there in the said dwelling house there feloniously did steal take and carry away.
2. And the jurors aforesaid upon their oath aforesaid do further present that the said Ah Ho afterwards on the day and year aforesaid (took) five ounces of platinum and one ounce of gold of the goods and chattels of Joseph Brunet and Charles Debarro before this feloniously stolen taken and carried away, feloniously, did receive and have, he the said Ah Ho at the time when he so secured the said ounce of gold and five ounces of platinum as aforesaid. This well knowingly the same to have been feloniously stolen taken and carried away.

VERDICT – NOT GUILTY
