Dear Friend

I thought I would write and give you my opinion in reference to what you asked me. Now I think from what I hear here that there is a good chance for this Co. There has been a lot of gold taken out of there from what I hear from the people around the place. If you have the ability to sell stock as you said I should think that it would be a little Klondike in it self for you. I will write you further from the mines as we start today. Mr. Coleman will be in Seattle about the 10th or 12th. You had ought to see him. Mr. Coleman will give you a full idea as to how everything is. Now don't forget to write as you said and let me know how everything is. Give my regards to all I know. Goodby for a while. I hope you will be one of us soon. Address
