She passed away 7 years ago and was interred at the Princeton Cemetery. Her family wanted her buried at the Granite Creek Cemetery; however, at the time of her death, the Granite Creek Cemetery was closed, and officials would not allow her to be buried in the family plot. It was Edith's passing that began our journey to have the Granite Creek Cemetery reopened. The Rice family decided to move Edith to the Granite Creek Cemetery now that it is permitted. It is comforting to have her in the family plot where she belongs.
